HIGH SCHOOL BOARD.—The High School Board met in the City Chamber on the 17th inst. The following members being present: G. Draper, chairman; W. McKinney, R. Ferguson, A. Austin, and W. H. Hing. The following resolution was adopted by the Board: That the Board abandon the idea of erecting an iron fence in front of the School building, and that there be put up a fence not to exceed in price 7500 feet; and that the offer of Peter Lillo to sell the portion of land lying in the rear of the High School lot, being about one-third of an acre, for the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be accepted, the same to be paid in three annual payments of \$50, from the first day of October next, with interest at 7 per cent. The plan submitted by Mr. Hess for fence for the east and north sides was adopted. At this stage of the proceedings the Councillors Hess, Gibbs and Woods left their places, and Councillors Dingman and Binna having previously withdrawn from the meeting, the Council stood adjourned for want of a quorum.

SHOULD BE STOPPED.—A commendable effort has been made to beautify the streets of the town by encouraging the planting of trees thereon, and we are pleased to notice that so many of our citizens have planted shade trees in front of their premises.

This is certainly a commendable step. Another commendable step would be to see that the streets are kept clean and free from rubbish. It does seem as if some of our citizens were unable to comprehend the fitness of things to witness the heaps of rubbish which are deposited in the streets in front of their dwellings, where they are allowed to remain and create a nuisance in what might with a proper degree of tidiness be attractive thoroughfares. A gentle reminder from the police officer would no doubt have a salutary effect.

A communication was read from A. B. Atwater, Esq., re: Elms at east crossing on the Grand Trunk R. The Finance Committee brought in their report, recommending payment of the following accounts: Hugh McCullough, for town bell, \$20; Wm. Bradley, supplies for traps, \$1.10; Jno. Livingstone, tickets for indigents, \$4; W. H. Hacking, use of blackboard, \$3; Listowel (Gas Co.), gas, and meter to July, \$2.50; do, gas posts, \$18.75; do, for gas piping, \$13. On motion the report was adopted. Councillors Scott, Riggs, Gibbs, and McDonald entered and took their seats at the Council Board.
