ST. STEPHEN, N. B. The captain and twelve men of the 'Kontiger' were landed at Shields, where they gave details of the destruction of their vessel. The German submarine commander, after examining the Norwegian vessel's papers, is quoted by the crew as saying: 'Well, I suppose I must do it. I am very sorry, but it is my duty. I am sick and tired of the whole business.' The ship was then saturated with paraffin and set on fire.
