Seeking to Create a New Demand

San Francisco, Aug. 13.—Russia is seeking to create in the United States a market for Russian koustar, or lace handwork of peasants, with a view to providing employment for her maim ed and crippled soldiers, according to an announcement made to-day by Theodore Kryshtofovich, special commissioner from Russia to the United Petrograd via Japan. The direction of the lace industry, the commissioner said, has been taken over by the Russian Government. Able-bodied peasants will no longer be allowed to make lace. The work will be turned over to crippled soldiers incapacitated Music.

"I am on my way to New York, where a large shipment of samples of Russian koustar handwork is awaiting my arrival," said the commissioner. Mr. Kryshtofovich was formerly Russian agricultural commissioner at St. Louis, Mo.


