Wheelmen Fined.

The Police Court Deals With Eight Cases at \$1 Each.

Punishment for Infraction of the Law Will Be More Serious in Future.

Two drunks and nine other cases occupied the attention of Police Magistrate Parke at the city police court this morning for about an hour. The bicyclists were: William Benson, Hugh Niven, Frank F. Radway, G. R. B. Sippl, Bennet Kerrigan and W. E. Saunders. All were charged with infraction of the bylaw by either riding too fast in the park or on the sidewalk.

The police magistrate asked if they could not see by the papers that they were doing wrong, and remarked that a \$1 fine didn't seem to have much effect. He fined the whole party \$1 each. He also instructed Clerk Moulie to keep a record of these cases, and intends to make a repetition of these offenses a costly occurrence.

James Wyatt appeared to answer a summons from Collector Bell, accusing him with non-payment of his status labor tax. Mr. Wyatt explained that he had been a householder for eight years, and had a wife and four children.

Collector Bell thought him careless in having neglected to set his name on the roll, and believed he had only voted once in four years.

As Chief Williams thought that a wife and four children was a heavy assessment, the P. M. dismissed the case.

John Reddick was warned not to allow his cow to run at large any more, and let off.

Thomas Shobottom, charged with obstructing the Dundas street sidewalk with berry crates, was discharged. His business was of such a nature that time could not be had to remove these goods the instant they arrived.

Michael Kennedy was taxed \$3 on twenty days, but Dan Sinclair was discharged.

A Peculiar Theft.

Which Caused the Arrest of an Innocent Man.

Mr. Joe Benenati's Experiences—He Was Given the Ring.

It took Mr. Joe Benenati, a well-known London boy, just half an hour to prove his innocence of a serious charge and secure honorable acquittal at the Windsor police court yesterday. He is in London today receiving the congratulations of his friends.

Mr. Benenati, while visiting his parents here, was arrested on a charge of stealing \$12.50 in cash and three diamond rings from Miss Alice Wilmur, of Windsor, who boarded at the same house as Mr. Benenati.

Miss Wilmur's sister, who was visiting in London, recognized one of the rings on his finger as the property of Miss Wilmur, hence the arrest. It appears that the rings and money were stolen by an intimate girl friend of Miss Wilmur's, whom the latter chief never suspect. The same evening the fair thief met Mr. Benenati, who was on his way to the train at the time, and who had helped Miss Wilmur to search for her property, and asked him to keep the stolen rings for her. She had evidently grown alarmed, Mr. Benenati declined, but fearing she might dispose of them he offered to take one, give her the other two, and return them to her while in London, intending to give it to the owner on his return to Windsor.

But Miss Wilmur's sister anticipated him. At the police court yesterday Mr. Benenati refused point blank to reveal the name of the thief, as he felt it a point of honor not to do so. He was at once acquitted and discharged. Mr. Benenati rightly says he would hardly have furnished a ring so openly if he had intended stealing it.
