LONDON, Jan. 21 .- 6:35 p.m. - Sir Edward Grey, the British foreign secretary, today submitted to Walter Hines Page, the American ambassador, the reply of the British Government to the state department's request that the former Hamburg-American Line steam-Removes all dandruff, stops ship Dacia, which now flies the American flag, be permitted to make a spe-cial trip to Germany with a cargo




