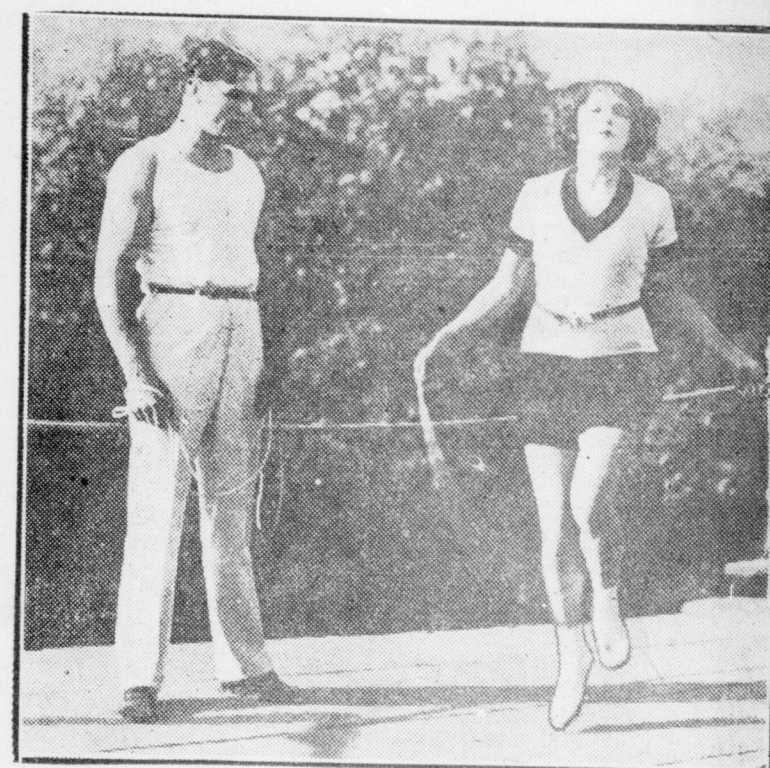
Gloria Swanson, movie star, left New York on the S.S. Berengaria for a trip abroad. She will occupy the suite which the Prince of Wales used on his trip over

Stanley Harris, manager of the fast traveling Washington Senators, is threatening to usurp the Yankees' chance to defend their championship in the fast approaching world series



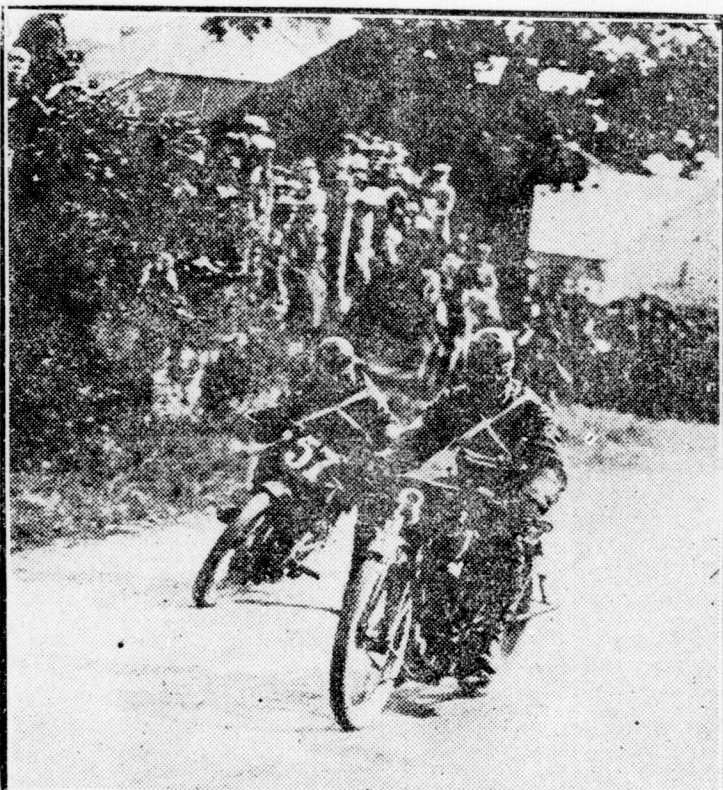

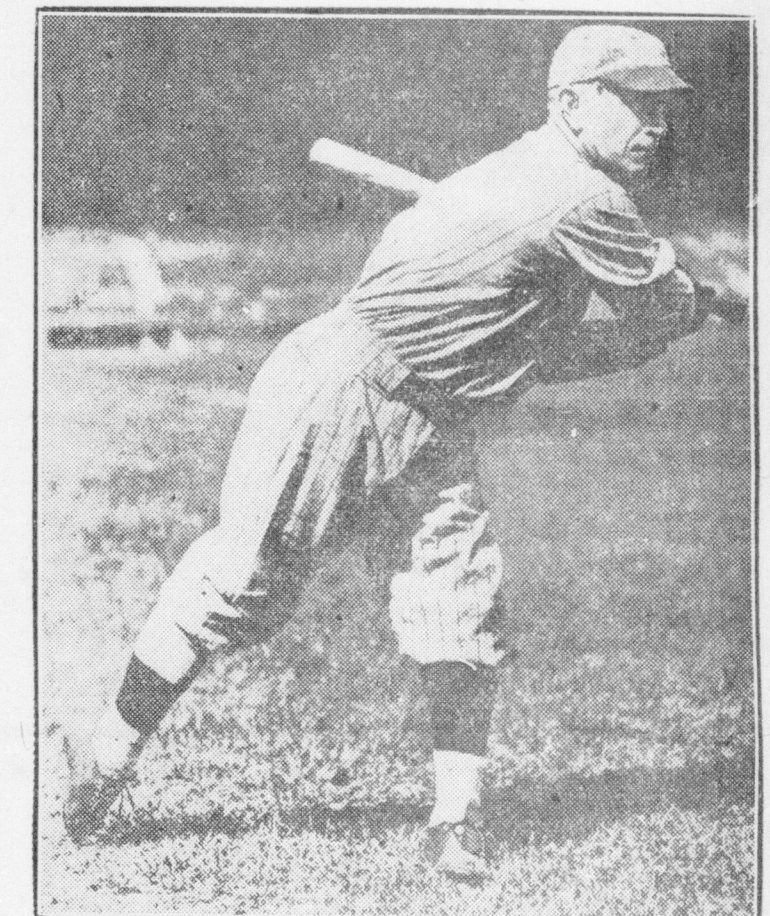
General A. H. Bell of Calgary has recently been appointed to command the Toronto Military District No. 2
