Spanish Influenza

Department of the Provincial Secretary Provincial Board of Health

Investigations carried on by the Canadian Army Medical Corps overseas, has developed the fact that the so-called Spanish Influenza has a different causation from that of the ordinary La Grippe of 1889 and which is due to the Bacillus Influenzae commonly called Pfeiffer's bacillus. The causative organism in the present outbreak is believed to be a very small Gram-positive diplococcus found in the upper air-passages of infected persons. The infection is commonly passed on by direct personal contact, drinking utensils, towels, etc.

Symptoms. Clinically the disease simulates influenza. It is an acute febrile infectious condition of three or four days duration. The most striking symptoms are: Sudden onsets with chills; severe headache with pain in cervical, dorsal and lumbar regions, also pain in limbs and general malaise. The face is somewhat flushed and herpes labialis is to be noticed in a few cases. The fever soon attains its maximum, which varies from 99 deg. to 102 deg. Several cases were observed in which the maximum temperature was 103 deg. to 104 deg. Usually the highest point is reached on the second day, then follows an abrupt crisis, and on the fourth day the man feels practically normal. Many cases develop a cough, harsh in nature, with a thick sputum, scanty in amount and constant in appearance. It is not the greenish sputum of influenza proper, but is of a white mucoid nature. The urine is somewhat scanty, the appetite poor, and the bowels are constipated.

It will be noted: (1) That the pyrexia is of shorter duration; (2) that the total course of the disease is shorter; (3) that the gastro-intestinal symptoms are slighter than in the form of influenza due to the Bacillus Influenzae commonly called Pfeiffer's bacillus. It is also noteworthy that convalescence is rapid and that as yet we have noted no cases of relapses or recurrence or of complications. It must be remembered that the cases under our observation were young, healthy soldiers in prime physical condition.

Cases of infection should be sent to bed and the services of a physician secured.

The New Yarn Industry For Royal City

Company Equipping a New Factory

Mr. D.M. Sanson president of the Dominion Linens, Limited, announced yesterday at the Board of Trade luncheon that he had made definite arrangements for the establishment of a flax spinning industry in Guelph, and that the property which has been occupied for some time by the Kawneer Mfg. Co., situated in close proximity to the linen mills, had been purchased for that purpose. It has been known for some time that suitable buildings for the establishment of this industry have been sought here, and several offers of buildings in other places have also been received, but Mr. Sanson, who has always been loyal to Guelph, exercised his influence to have this most important industry brought to Guelph, and the people of this city are to be congratulated on the result.

This means that linen yarns will be manufactured in Guelph as soon as the necessary machinery and other equipment has been secured. This machinery is valued to be between \$210,000 and 240,000 and two-thirds of it will be in operation in four months' time. It is the finest and most modern equipment that can be secured, and is all of British manufacture from the factories of James Mackie & Sons Limited, of Belfast, and Combe Barbour Co., Belfast and Rawsons of Leeds. They will have both wet and dry spinning both top and line spinning yarns, which will run as high as 800 lbs. The machinery will have automatic feeds and doffing and also a Cotton's automatic hacking machine. This latter combs out the fibre.

Asked as to what sort of building was required to house the new industry, Mr. Sanson says they will require at least 24,000 square feet of floor space for the machinery that is already ordered. They will employ at the start between 80 and 100 hands. The manufacture of linen yarns in Canada has become a necessity owing to war time conditions. Previous to the war the entire supply of yarns used in this country was imported from foreign countries, but not a shipment was arrived in nearly a year. Flax, the raw material for the yarns is grown in Canada extensively and is of the finest quality in the world, but hitherto the entire crop has been shipped out of the country to be made up into yarns which are shipped back again.

It is Mr. Sanson's idea to make Guelph a flax centre and a linen centre for Canada. This is now the centre of a flax growing district and the business is absolutely on a staple basis in Canada to-day.

The present plant is being increased by 100 looms in preparation for the output from the new factory. Shipment of these looms is assured and should be here in two or three months. Mr. Sanson says that the new factory could manufacture at least 800,000 pounds of linen yarns per annum and the output would be largely used here, with the balance being made for the trade. Of course, while the war is on much of the yarn will be used for airplane cloth and thread for soldiers' shoes.

Mr. J.W. Lyon vice-president of Dominion Linens Ltd. who always has the interests of Guelph in mind, is entitled to the credit for bringing the industry in question to Guelph. Mr. Lyon has given great assistance in connection with the problems that confronted the management in addition to giving a free site of six or seven acres upon which, in the near future it is proposed to erect scutch mills and other process for the treatment of the fibre.
