Mr. Con Heighton, of Cape John, was badry gored and trampled upon by a bull on the 15th August, and is reported by the Eastern Chronicle as being in e critical condition. -At Lochaber, on the 16th, Mr. Peter Stewart, coming out of his stable, was met by a neighbour's bull, and so mangled that he died on the 19th.-We hope exhibitors at Kentville will bear in mind the 25th regulation: "Exhibitors must supply themselves with proper fastenings for safely securing the animals in their stalls. All bulls (not under a year old) must have nose rings. It appears, however, that bulls horns are not the only instruments of death on the farm, an old gentleman was stung on the temple by a bee the other day, and, notwithstanding the speedy application of the proper remedies, died in a quarter of an hour.-Whilst recording these mishaps, we may apologise to our readers for the occupation of some of our space last month, by an obituary notice having no agricultural connection that we know of, the type of which our compositor had transferred by mistake to this Jounnal from some other publication printed in the same office.
