



### Scientific and Aseful.

DELICATE CAKE.—One pound of sugar three-quarters of a pound of butter, one pound of flour, and the whites of eighteen

LENON CREAM PIE. LEMON CREAM PIE.—One cup of sugar, one tablespoonful of butter, one egg, one lemon prepared oarefully, one teaspoonful of corn starch wet in cold water, one cup of boiling water. Silr the coin starch into the water and pour over the creamed butter and sugar. When cold add the lemon and egg. Beat hard and bake in open shells of maste. One cup of sugar, paste.

FRUIT CAKE.—One pound of sug. /1, three-quarters of a pound of butter, ten eggs, one pound of flour, four pounds of raisins, two and a half pounds of currants, one and a half pounds of citron, nutm-g, ground mice, essence of lemon, and a gill of brandy. This makes the richest cake, and one that will keep well for years it wrapped in a linen cloth and put in a stone jar.

Delicate Cake, No. 2.—One pound of sugar, three-quarters of a pound of flour, one half pound of butter, the whites of four-teen eggs. Let the butter get a little warm; then beat it until it is like cream. Add to the butter the flour and stir until it is free the other the hour and air until it is free from lumps; beat the eggs to a stiff froth; then add the sugar after that and the grated rind of a lemon and the juice. Bake like sponge cake.

CRANBERRY PUDDING. GRANBERRY PUDDING.—Cranberry pudding is made by pouring boiling water on a pint of dried bread crumbs; melt a table-spoonful of butter and stir in. When the bread is softened add two eggs, and beat thoroughly with the bread. Then put in a pint of the atewed fruit and sweeten to your taste. Bake in a hot oven for half an hour. taste. Bake in a hot oven for half an hour. Fresh fruit may be used in place of the cranberries. Slices of peaches put in layers make a delicious variation.

A LADY who has remarkable success in raising house plants reveals the secret of her method in a note to the New York Post. method in a note to the New York Post. The soil, she writes, is about two-thirds good garden soil and the rest is sand. It is keplight and loose about the roots, and the pions are watered only as they appear to need it. But the chief reason for their wonderful growth, and bloom is that when any of the leaves wither and fall, initead of throwing them away she makes little rolls of them and turks them down in the certh, where them tucks them down in the earth, where they decay. This is the only fertilizer she uses.

FRENCH CRUST FOR RAISED PIES .- To every pound of flour allow hell a teaspoonful of sait, two eggs, third of a oint of water, six ounces of butter. Spread the flour, which should be sifted and thoroughly dry, on the pasteboard, make a hole in the centre, into pasteboard, make a hole in the centre, into which put the butter, work it thoroughly into the flour, and when quite fine add the salt. Work the whole into a smooth paste with the eggs and water, and make it very firm. Knead the paste well, and let it be rather stiff, that the sides of the pie may be easily raised, and that they do not tumble or shrink.
