

- Perisemus formicoides* *Pror.* Female; Type of species.
Perisemus prolongus *Pror.* Female; several in May, June, and July.
Goniozus loveolatus *Ashm.* Two males and female; Powell's Grove and Hull, June, July and August.

SUBFAMILY III. DRYININÆ.

- Gonatopus contortulus* *Patton.* One female; Hull, 29 July.
Gonatopus flavifrons, *Ashm.* One female; Hull, 15 July.
Phorbas laticeps *Ashm.* One female; Hull, 15 July.
Chelogyne canadensis *Ashm.* One female; 4 June.
Aphelopus melaleucus *Dalm.*

SUBFAMILY IV. CERAPHRONINÆ.

- Habropelte fuscipennis* *Ashm.* One male.
Habropelte armatus *Say.* One male and one female.
Lygocerus picipes *Ashm.* One female; Kettle Island, 23 July. Two males; Hull, 16 and 26 Aug.
Lygocerus stigmatus *Say.* Male and female; several bred by Mr. Fletcher from Aphides on *Rubus strigosus*, July.
Megaspilus striatipes *Ashm.*
Megaspilus Harringtoni *Ashm.* Several; in July and Aug. One bred from Willow *Diplosis puparium* emerged in April.
Megaspilus canadensis *Ashm.*
Megaspilus Ottawaensis *Ashm.* Apparently a common species in August. Taken at Hull, Kingsmere and Racecourse. Several specimens also from moss from Dow's Swamp in Nov.
Ceraphron minutus *Ashm.* Also found in moss from same locality.
Ceraphron auripes *Ashm.* With the above.
Ceraphron melanocephalus *Ashm.* One female; Hull, 19 Aug.
Ceraphron pallidiventris *Ashm.* One at Beechwood on 13 Aug.
Ceraphron salicicola *Ashm.* From Willowgalls and also from moss. Taken at Hull, 19 Aug.
Ceraphron melanocerus *Ashm.* One specimen.
Ceraphron pedalis *Ashm.* Both sexes; Hull, all in Aug. except a female 13 May.
Ceraphron flaviscapus *Ashm.* Female; Dow's Swamp moss, Hull 13 May.
Ceraphron unicolor *Ashm.* Female; Hull 19 Aug.
Ceraphron sp. nov. Female; Hull 19 Aug. A large black species.
Ceraphron sp. nov. ? Female; a large pale species.
Aphanogmus bicolor *Ashm.* Female; from Dow's Swamp moss.
Aphanogmus marylandicus *Ashm.* ? Male; Beechwood, 13 Aug.

SUBFAMILY V. SCELIONINÆ.

- Telenomus orgyie* *Fitch.* Numerous specimens bred from eggs of *Orgyia* sp.
Telenomus gracilicornis *Ashm.*
