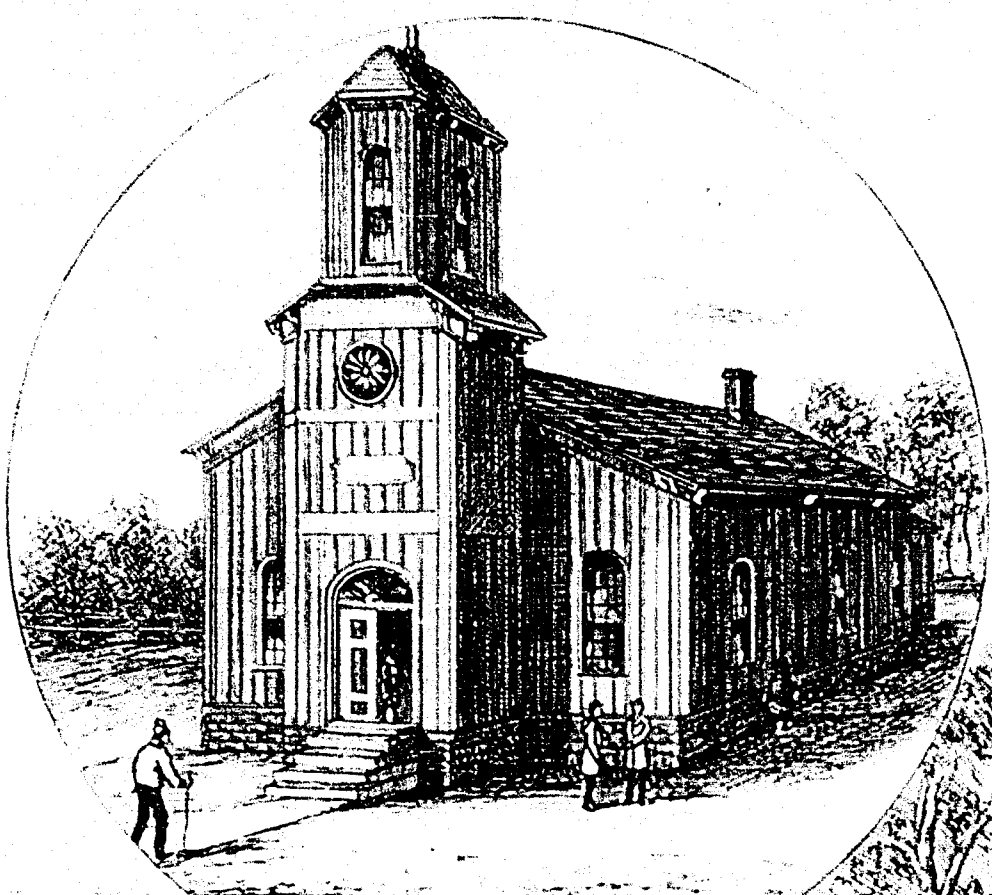
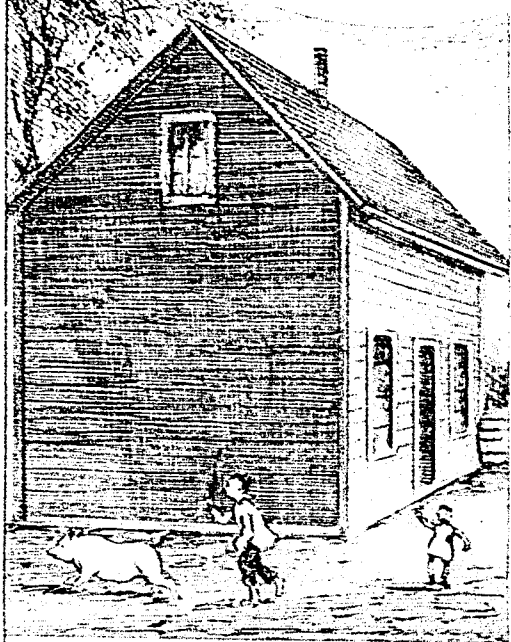

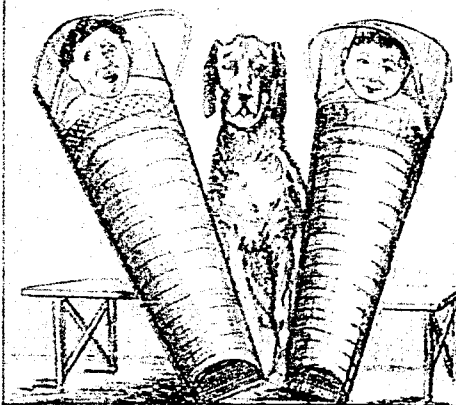

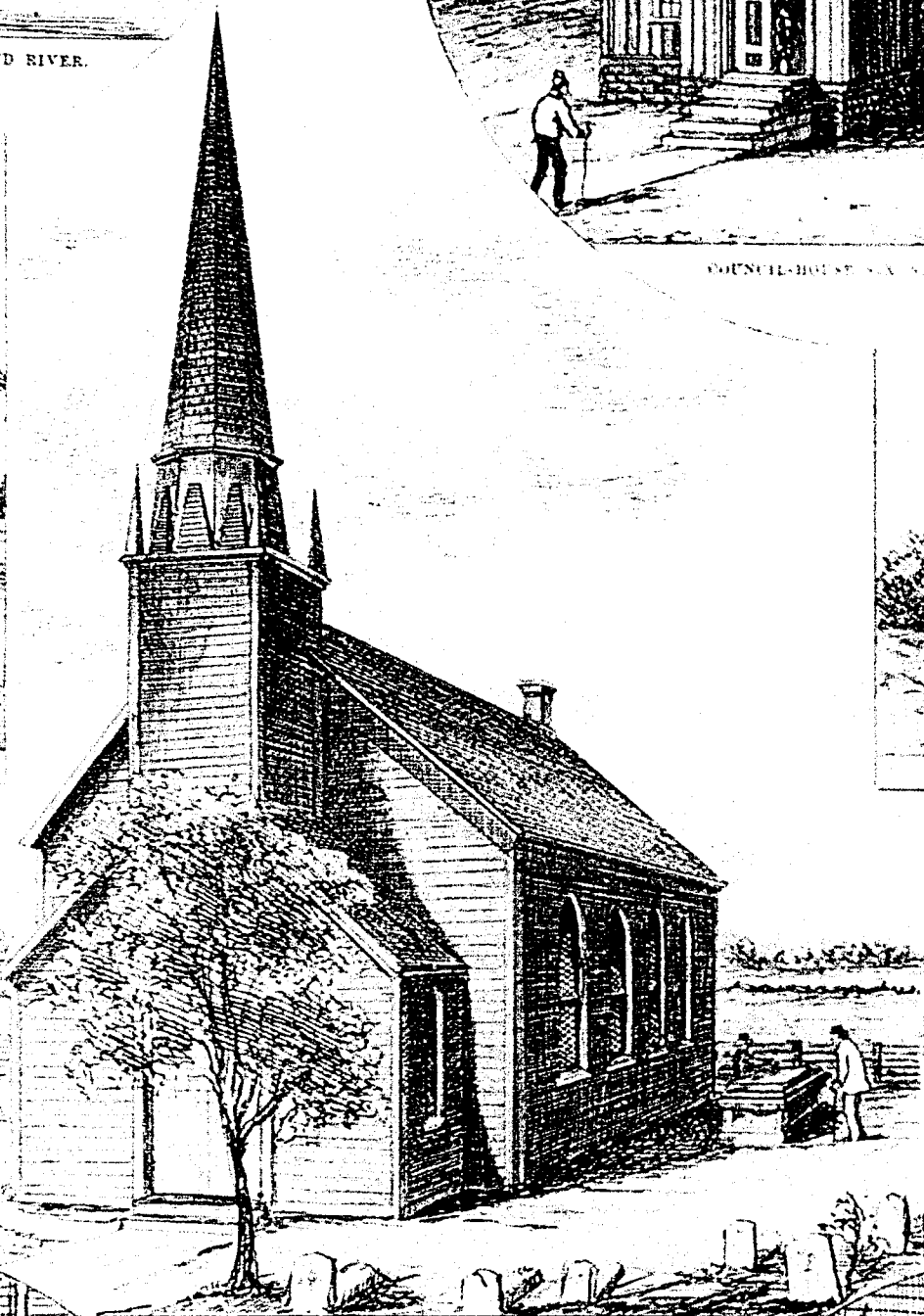

INDIAN WOMEN CARRYING WOOD.

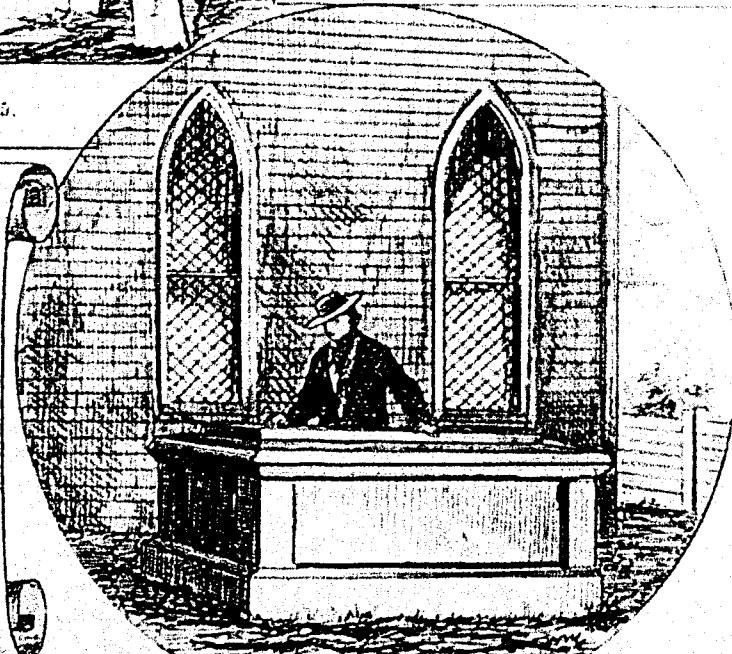


INDIAN WOMEN MAKING MOCCASINS AND BASKETS.

THAYENDANEJA OR  
CAPT. JOSEPH BRANT,  
PRINCIPAL CHIEF AND  
WARRIOR OF  
THE SIX NATION INDIANS  
BY HIS FELLOW SUBJECTS AND  
ADMIRERS OF HIS FIDELITY AND  
ATTACHMENT TO THE  
BRITISH CROWN.  
BORN ON THE BANKS OF THE  
OHIO RIVER 1742. DIED AT  
WELLINGTON SQUARE U. C. 1807

IT ALSO CONTAINS THE REMAINS  
OF HIS SON AHOOWAGHIS OR  
CAPT. JOHN BRANT,  
WHO SUCCEEDED HIS FATHER  
AS TETAKOHOGA AND  
DISTINGUISHED HIMSELF IN  
THE WAR OF 1812-13.  
BORN AT THE  
MOHAWK VILLAGE U. C. 1765.  
DIED AT THE SAME PLACE, 1832.
