A SIMPLE WATER FEST .- Into a perfectly clean bottle bottle, having a stopper of ground glass, put five ounces of the water to be tested. To the water add ten grains (by weight) of pure granulated white sugar. Cork tight and set in a window, exposed freely to light, but not to the direct rays of the sun. Do not disturb the bottle and keep the temper ature as near seventy degrees Fahrenheit as possible. If the water contains organic matter within fortyeight hours an abundance of whiti-h specks will be seen floating about, and the more organic matter the more specks. In a week or ten days, if the water is very bad, the odor of runcid butter will be noticed on re moving the stopper.
