The Committee of Supervision of Laws of Subordinates, $t_{0}$ whom has been referred the subject of the division of the Province into Districts, beg leave to report thereon as follows:

Within the limits of Lower Canada, they are of opinion that no better arrangement can at present be made, than that which is alrealy in practical operation, viz., the assignintr of the Judial i)istriets of Quebee and Gaspe to the superintendance of a District Deproty Grand Master, resident at Quebec, a, ithat of St. Francis to the superintendance of a Distriot 1 Stansteal; thus leavin the Judicial Districts of Montreal and Three livers umder the direct surveillance of the M. W. Gramd Master himself.

As regards Lpper Canada, they are of opinion that, for the present, it would be a satisfactory arrangement, to divide the Province iato four District Deputy (irand Masterships, the Hrst to comprise so mueh of Dper Camata as lies Fastward of the Midland District; the secon!, the Minlland, Victoria, and Prince Edward listriets; the third, Newoastle and Colbome Districts, and the fourth and largest, the Home District with the remainder of Lipper Canada to the westward. Each of these divisions would contain three Lodges; the first Brock, No. 9, Brockville: St. Francis, No. 1\&, Cornwall, and Ottawa, No. 21, Bytown; the second, Victoria. No. 6, Belleville; Catarayui, No. lo, Kinsson, and Prince Filward, No. 11, Picton; the third, Ontario, No 12, Coboure; Otonabee, No. 1:3, Petcrbors, and IF, es, No. 1f, Port Hope; the fourth, Tecumsel, No. 15 , Joronto; Union, No. 16 , st. Catherines, and Burlingtom, No. 17, Hamiltom.
