HOW TO COOK EGGS.

A boiled egg should either be digested. An authority upon cooking says that boiled eggs, to be at their best, should not be boiled at all. If desireed water just below the boiling point for 20 minutes. For soft eggs, put them in cold water, and when the water reaches the boiling boint the egg should be taken out, and it will be found creamy and delicate.

When poaching eggs, to make them into a ball shape, but one egg should be cooked at a time. After the water begins to boil rapidly stir it around until a small circle is formed in the water, drop the egg into the the middle, and the motion of the boiling water will form a circular covering of white around the unbroken yoke.—Ex.
