PRAYERS.

The following item, standing under the heading "Introduction of Bills" on the Order Paper, was called and ordered for consideration later this day:

The Prime Minister—Bill intituled: "An Act for the Recognition and Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms".

Mr. Smith (Hastings-Frontenac), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Exchange of Notes between Canada and the United States of America concerning the establishment of a Canada-United States Committee on Joint Defense. Signed at Ottawa, August 29 and September 2, 1958. In force September 2, 1958. (English and French).

The Orders of the Day having been called:

Pursuant to Order made this day, Mr. Diefenbaker, seconded by Mr. Green, by leave of the House, introduced a Bill, No. C-60, An Act for the Recognition and Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms, which was read the first time.

After a debate on the provisions of the said Bill, by unanimous consent; it was ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The House resumed debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Nowlan, seconded by Mr. Harkness,—That Bill No. C-51, An Act to amend the Customs Act, be now read a second time.
