THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL SD-17.

An Act for the relief of Beverley Trachtenberg, otherwise known as Beverley Tratt.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Beverley Trachtenberg, otherwise known as Beverley Tratt, residing at the city of Westmount, in the province of Quebec, wife of Arthur Trachtenberg, otherwise known as Arthur Tratt, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the said province, has 5 by her petition alleged that they were married on the twentieth day of September, A.D. 1945, at the said city of Westmount, she then being Beverley Maron; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas 10 the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:-15

Marriage dissolved. **1.** The said marriage is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
