ECLIPSES IN 1848.

There will be Six Eclipses this year, *four of the Sun*, and *two*
of the Moon. There will also be a transit of the Planet *MERCURY*.

I. March 5, a partial eclipse of the Sun, invisible to the gre-
ter part of British North America—it will be seen at Labrador,
Newfoundland and Greenland.

II. March 19, a total eclipse of the Moon, part of which will
be visible in the British Provinces:—
