ADJUTANT-GENERAL'S OFFICE OF MILITIA,

HEAD-QUARTERS, MONTREAL, November 17, 1814. (CIRCULAR.)

In consequence of a General Order of the 12th instant, relative to Militiamen who may have been Killed or Wounded in an Engagement with the Enemy, His Excellency has ordered me to detail you more particularly in which manner the Returns that you are to furnish me, are to be made out.

1stly. Instead of the 24th of May and 24th November, these Returns are to be made out on 1st April and 1st October.

2dly. The age of such Militiamen's Children, are to be specified in the Return, and a certificate of the Commanding Officer of the Division of Sedentary Militia to whom the Militiaman formerly belonged is to be transmitted to the Adjutant-General's Office, certifying that the said Widow is still unmarried.

3dly. The Return is to specify the day that the Militiaman has been killed or found by his wound unfit for service or incapable of gaining his livelihood, this is to be certified by the Doctor of the Battalion to whom he belonged.
