LAURIER DARED NOT SUPPORT MONDOU

Mondou pointedly taunted him with not coming out and declaring himself. Third Reading Tuesday. The bill was reported after considerable debate on an amendment of the Hon. Frank Oliver, and will come up for third reading on Tuesday.

The premier announced that the government was considering the question of representation. He thought the best solution might be found in the amendment to the B. N. A. Act, declaring that only the original four provinces should be taken into consideration as far as any reduction in representation was concerned.

Mr. Mondou supported his amendment by a half-hour speech in French. Two-Edged Argument. He argued that parliament might legally impose conditions upon the entrance of the territory in question into Manitoba.

Amendment Went Too Far. J. A. M. Alkins (Brandon) complained that the amendment assumed that there were separate schools existing, and that there might be Protestant or Roman Catholic minorities which had rights in regard to separate schools.

But neither did this government create separate schools. In the eyes of the law there were then no separate schools and therefore there were no school rights in the territory to be annexed to Manitoba.

What right? he asked. This parliament to put limitations on a government now existing? It has no right to change the constitution of Manitoba.

After Mr. Mondou's amendment had been disposed of, Hon. Frank Oliver moved in amendment, "Inasmuch as, under the provisions of this act, the province will not have the public lands as a source of revenue, then shall, subject to the provisions hereinafter set out, be paid by the government to the province by half-yearly payments in advance on the first days of January and July in each year, an annual sum based upon the population of the territory proposed to be added to the province, as from time to time ascertained by the quinquennial census as follows: "The sum payable until the population of such territory reaches 100,000 shall be \$200,000.

Will Listen to Saskatchewan. Right Hon. R. L. Borden said the government would give most careful consideration to any representations which might be made by the government of Saskatchewan. So far as the



TO NATIONALIZE Y.M.C.A. WORK

Nationalization of the Y.M.C.A. movement in Canada was unanimously endorsed at the interprovincial convention of Ontario and Quebec at the Friends' Church yesterday.

Secretary Copeland asserted that with Dominion supervision and initiative, rather than as a section of an international association, the Y.M.C.A. movement would be more progressive, strong and effective.

A motion in favor of a union of the boys' departments of Sunday schools with the boys' departments of the Y. M. C. A. was also adopted.

The afternoon session was devoted to a conference on spiritual power.

BETTER CARE FOR DEFECTIVES

Hon. W. J. Hanna Says Children Must Be Protected, and Promised Immediate Consideration.

Declaring that a public institution to care for mentally defective children was a dire necessity in the province, a deputation from the board of education and city council called at the parliament buildings yesterday and pressed the fact upon Hon. W. J. Hanna.

The deputation, which comprised a sub-committee on medical inspection of the board of education, was represented by Trustees Lewis, Hartney and Hill, and Mayor Geary, Controller (Church, Dr. Struthers, chief medical inspector, and Dr. Helen MacMurchy.

Mr. Hanna was told that there were a large number of mentally unbalanced children attending public schools, in which special classes were provided for them. Instances were given to show that the government should build a special institution. It was pointed out that the public schools could not train them to become good citizens. Under present conditions when grown up they would fill the jails and public institutions or reproduce their kind in the community. And it was a duty incumbent upon the government to take immediate action.
