Press.)--According to record of industrial acci-dents maintained in the department of labor, that of the month of August showed that 88 were killed and 305 in-jured as compared with 108 fatal and 272 non-fatal accidents during the month of July; or a decrease of 20 in the number of fatal, and an increase of 30 non-fatal accidents as compared with the record for July. The largest number of fatalities -oc-curred in the building trades and in the steam railway systems, there being 11 workmen killed in the former, and 25 in the latter.
