Minnesota, March 8.—Montana flax seed, selling today at \$4.21 a bushel at the Minneapolis Chamber of Commerce, was said by grain men to represent the highest price ever paid for flax anywhere.

MILK COMPANIES REBEL
Chicago, March 8.—A national rebellion of condensed milk companies against milk prices fixed by the federal food administration was said to be inaugurated today.

U.S. WAR COUNCIL CHANGES
Washington, March 8.—Reorganization of the war council was announced today by the war department.

TO LIMIT BOND OUTPUT
Washington, March 8.—In completing its revision of the war finance corporation bill passed yesterday by the senate, the house ways and means committee today reduced from four to two the number of bonds to be issued.
