STARVATION AT SANTIAGO DE CUBA

Fourteen Thousand People Said to be Without Food—The Death Rate is Appalling.

Santiago de Cuba, Feb. 23.—While the United States cruiser Montgomery was at Matanzas recently a board of officers was appointed to enquire into the condition of the people of the province. There are 14,000 people absolutely without food and clothing within the city limits. These 14,000 are the laboring people, who have been driven into the cities from their country homes, which have been destroyed by the operations of the war. Most of them are women and children, and they are all emaciated, weak and almost beyond relief unless they can be fed. The death rate is appalling. In the city of Matanzas alone there have been about 11,000 deaths during the past year, and the number is increasing daily. The death rate at present averages 46 per day.

AGAIN WILL NOT SELL CUBA.

All Politicians in the Old Country are United on That Question.

Madrid, Feb. 23.—As the question of the purchase of Cuba is again being pushed in Washington, it may be well to state, on the highest authority, that Spain will never, no matter what Government is in power, sell Cuba. Any suggestion or any compromise in Cuba beyond the present measure of autonomy drafted by the Liberal Government, this is an absolute, irrevocable decision. People who suggest anything else are only wasting time and arousing unfounded hopes.
