### HAMILTON'S DILEMMA TOO MANY BLACK BEARS

Can't Sell 'em—Everybody Seems to Have 'em—General News of the Ambitious City.

**HAMILTON, Dec. 11.—(Special).—**The parks board met this afternoon and completed the purchase of six acres of the Gage property on the top and face of the mountain for \$2500. It was decided to offer two of the Dundurn Zoo black bears for sale. The board has been trying to trade them for some other kind of animal, but everybody seems to have more black bears than they know what to do with. George Hope wanted to know if the city would be compensated for the damage done to the park by the Hamilton, Waterloo & Guelph Railway, and he was informed that this point had not yet been settled.

The board will examine the plans filed by the company to see that they agree with the McCallum route. One of the park leasers will be installed in the Dundurn Castle.

At the general sessions Timothy Higgins, 86 years of age, suing W. T. Stevens for \$200 damages for assault. Both are contractors, and the alleged assault took place over the building of a summer kitchen. The case was not finished to-day.
