"The word-mongering and phrasemaking at Washington have spread into Canada like a contagion, and the fully interpreting Senator Lodge's interpretation of that clause of the league covenant which gives Great Britain and its dependencies six votes. "As the president of the privy coun-

cil views the matter, the reservation adopted by the United States senate does more than deprive Canada of a vote in the league when some portion of the British empire is in disagreement with the United States—a principle which applies to all members ensaged in disputes, and to which he offers no objection.

"What he condemns is the apparent denial that Canada is a nation, and the purpose of certain United States senators to relegate it to its former colonial status.

"If the United States is to ratify the peace treaty on any condition im-pairing the independence of Canada, he said, that country, already a signatory, will refuse its assent, and if thru any influence Great Britain should fall in with such a proposition, Canada would withdraw from the league at
