COUNTRY MARKET

Tomorrow Will See Good Supply in All Lines of Produce.

The Christmas month will begin to-morrow with a goodly supply of produce in the country market, and the retail prices will be as follows:

Beef, 10 to 12 cents per lb; mutton, 14 to 20 cents per lb; moose, 20 cents; lamb, 10 to 14 cents; bacon, 18 cents and ham 18 cents.

Chicken, 20 cents per lb; turkeys are selling at 20 cents per lb; chickens are bringing from 75c. to \$1.25 per pair; ducks demand \$1.20 to \$1.50; geese, \$1.00 to \$1.25; woodcock, 60 cents per pair; partridge, 80 cents per pair; black duck, \$1.00 per pair; white ducks, 60 cents per pair.

Potatoes are bringing from \$1.75 to \$2.00 per bushel; carrots 30 cents per bushel; pumpkins, 35 cents; turnips, 18 cents; beets, 30 cents; onions, 5 cents lb; apples 25 to 30 cents per bushel; quarts; beans 10 to 12 cents per quart; eggs 30 to 40 cents dozen, and butter 26 to 30 cents per lb.
