Salaries \$7,300,000.

A statistical person has just arrived at the conclusion that the baseball players received \$7,800,000 in salaries last season, and that it cost nearly \$2,000,000 more to provide sleeping accommodations, railroad fares and other expenses incidental to the season's playing. There are 200 players in each of the big leagues, each drawing an average salary of \$8,000. This brings the total to \$1,800,000. In the minors—all the minors under the protection of the National Commission—there were 5,500 in 1915. The average salary was \$1,000, which means that the minors drew down \$5,500,000 in salaries, which added to the \$1,80,000 paid to the major leagues, bring the salary total to \$7,800,000. In the list of expenses are traveling expenses for twenty-four clubs, and \$20,000 each means \$480,000. The 800 minor league clubs spent \$1,500,000 for traveling, making a total of \$2,000,000.
