MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

Benjamin Brown and Robert Hamilton of Tack's Beach, Nfld., perished in the blizzard which swept over Newfoundland recently. They were crossing the ice in a blinding snow storm and went through. The bodies were recovered. Railway service has been suspended throughout the colony and the steamer Kyle, which was expected to sail for Canadian ports was forced to cancel her sailing.

The rotary mill at Rock Gulch, near Campbellton, was destroyed by fire early yesterday morning. The loss will be about \$80,000 partially covered by insurance.
