Chairman Mulligan to go Abroad to Prepare for Withdrawal

Within a few days William J. Mulligan, chairman of the Knights of Columbus committee on war activities, will sail for Europe to begin salvaging propert—of the organization that has been used in its war activities. He will visit France, Belgium and the Rhineland.

The salvage work involves hundreds of thousands of dollars' worth of buildings and warehouses that will have to be dismantled. These are widely scattered in the Belleau Woods, at Chateau-Thierry, in the Argonne, along the left bank of the Meuse, and in every section where American troops were, from the Swiss border to the Belgian coast.

One place that will be dismantled will be the K. of C. doughnut kitchen at Coblenz, Germany, where 10,000,000 doughnuts were turned out for the army of occupation. Speaking of the work being done, Mr. Mulligan said:

"We still have 500 secretaries abroad, and 200 places which for some time will be busy. We will remain overseas as long as there is need of our services, and that means until the American army dwindles to the last few hundred men.


