Killed in Action

The Situation in Ireland

The attempt of Sir Roger Casement and others to land arms and ammunition on the west coast of Ireland was completely frustrated by a British patrol, which sunk the German auxiliary ship, a 1100 ton steamer. The submarine accompanying her escaped. Casement and his companions landed in a rowboat from the German submarine, and were immediately arrested by the British Navy Secret Service men who seized an automobile with Irish confederates awaiting Sir Roger's landing. Those arrested include Sir Roger Casement, who is now confined in the Tower of London, two Irish Confederates and 22 Germans who comprised the crew of the German auxiliary.

The rebellion in Dublin was coincident with the landing and arrest of Casement, and also with the raid on Yarmouth and Lowestoft, and no doubt was a pre-arranged plan. The capture reveals an extensive plot, having ramifications in Germany, Ireland and America. Irish American cities are said to have been largely instrumental in financing a revolutionary movement.

Austin Stack, Accountant in the General Postoffice at Dublin, and Cornelius Collins has also been arrested. Both are charged with conspiracy in aiding the importation of arms from an enemy. Another man of unknown nationality has been arrested. Eleven insurgents are known to have been killed at Dublin during the riot.

The rebellion in Dublin was by the Sinn Feiners. In the House of Lords Viscount Middleton said the present condition of Ireland was one of the greatest dangers. Early Monday the rebels attacked Dublin Castle, seized Stephen's Green, held up the troops who were returning from barracks, fired on them from the roofs of buildings, seized the Postoffice, City Hall, four courts and Weston.
