The student is advised to pass the Matriculation Examination in March, so that his four years of pupilage may expire at the close of a winter session. This examination is recommended to be passed before the attendance of a Medical Course—it is similar to that required by McGill University, Montreal, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, and recommended by the "Council of Medical Education and Registration" of Great Britain. The time set apart for this examination will be made known after the commencement of the Session. Graduates in Arts of recognized Universities are not required to submit to the Matriculation Examination.

While the University regulations permit a Student to graduate after three years attendance upon Lectures, provided he furnish proof that he has studied one year, before attending Lectures, with a private practitioner, yet he is recommended to devote four Sessions to Systematic Instruction, as less time is scarcely sufficient in which to acquire a fair knowledge of the many subjects which compose the curriculum.

N.B.—Stutents who have attended one of the three month sessions of this Faculty will be required to attend three six month sessions additional to qualify for graduation. (The summer session being received as equivalent to the "year with a preceptor."). Students who have attended two of the three-month sessions will be required to attend two six month sessions additional before graduating, so that the four years in time will be complied with. With regard to study two of the three month tickets on any subject will be considered as equivalent to one of six months on the same subject. An equitable arrangement will be made with those Students who have taken out courses of three months, so that the class fees which have been paid will be credited in the six month course on the same subject.
