

Lord Lorne in British Columbia AN ADDRESS TO THE INDIANS.

The following speech was delivered by e Governor-General to nearly two thou sand Indians assembled at New Westminster, B. C.:

minster, B. C.: "The Queen's daughter and myself are very glad to see you. The Queen's daugh-ter has come a longer way to see you than you have come to see her. I am glad to hear from you that you appreciate the Queen's Government, and that there is equal justice between white and red men in this country. I shall tell the Queen the good accounts I have heard of you, and that you are progressing well here. Last year on the plains, and elsewhere, I had opportunitizes of meeting very many Last year on the plains, and elsewhere, I had opportunities of meeting very many thousands of red men, and I have nowhere heard better accounts than here. It gives me great pleasure to find here how you are become like the white men, and work for yourselves, and that, under the advan-tages of the Queen's Government, you have become independent. I shall enquire with reference to the possibilities of sup-olving you with schools, and I shall er. known that the City and Provincial Poors Asylum was on fire.
