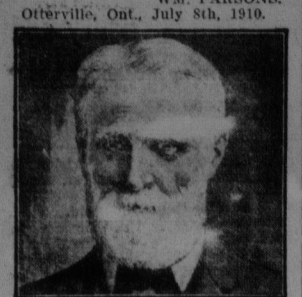

LAIDLAW'S CLOSING LETTER. New York, Feb. 24.—The surprising nature of the interstate commerce commission's decisions in the matter of freight rates was announced after the close yesterday and caused a flood of telegrams in the London market where prices at one time ranged from 3 to 15 points below a parity with our closing. First prices here were from 2 to 4 points lower but the undertone was far from demoralized and during the remainder of the day the broad tendency was toward recovery.
