LOST 45 SHIPS

Sir Alfred Booth Tells Magnitude of Work Performed During the War and the Company's Prospects for Future.

BEST TYPES OF SHIPS WERE LOST

Pays Splendid Tribute to the Work of Women Who Were Employed in the Shell Making Factories Taken Over by Cunard Co.

New York, June 3. -Sir Alfred Booth, chairman of the board of directors of the Cunard Steamship Company, Ltd., presided at the first meeting of the directors held since the war just before his leaving from England and summarized some of the interesting and significant figures concerning its tonnage losses and the war record of the Cunard and allied lines.

"Now that the war is over," he said, "it is possible to tell what has happened to the company during the last four and a half years. The losses during the war period have been very heavy. Best types of ships.

"In all we have lost forty-five ships of 330,000 tons," said Sir Alfred. "It will have been noticed that the losses of both the Cunard and Anchor lines have fallen most heavily on the best types of combined cargo and passenger steamships of moderate speed, and the first place in the building programme of the Cunard and Anchor lines has been given to vessels of this class."
