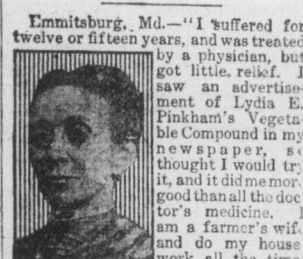
"I told yoh," he says, "I had a headache. I fancied the air would revive me; I was restless."
