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

mences next week is by Isabel Ecclestone MacKay. Mrs. MacKay has not a great reputation as a novelist. Her only publication up to the present time is a volume of verse which was published in 1904. She has written a number of short stories and her work has been published in Harper's, Scribner's, McClure's, Ainslee's, The Red Book, Youth's Companion, St. Nicholas, Life, and other United States publications. She has also contributed to the leading Canadian periodicals. Mrs. MacKay was born in Woodstock, Ontario, and lived there until quite recently. She is now a resident of Vancouver.

The story by Mrs. MacKay which we intend to publish is a purely Canadian story. Some people may think it is too Canadian since the scenes described may be somewhat too familiar to the average reader. Nevertheless, we hope that on the whole our readers will consider it one of the best Canadian stories they have ever read. It will be completed in eight issues of the paper.
