An Act to extend the jurisdiction of County Councils in Upper Canada over County Roads.

ER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:-

1. In addition to the powers conferred upon county councils by the Preamble. Municipal Act of Upper Canada to appoint overseers of highways, and County Coun-5 to regulate the duties and remuneration of such officers, the municipal cils may require Statute corporation of every county in Upper Canada (except provisional cor-Labor, in cerporations) may pass by-laws to divide the several county roads into road tain cases, to divisions, and to enact that the actual residents or occupiers of lots or be applied on County Roads parts of lots adjoining county roads shall perform their statute labor 10 upon such roads, under the several overseers appointed to superintend the work, or pay their commutation money, in lieu of work, to such overseers: Provided always, that the operation of such by-law, as Proviso. regards the performance of statute labor or payment of commutation money by such residents or occupiers as aforesaid, may be limited to

15 any one or more of such county roads, or part or parts thereof, at the discretion of the council passing the same. 2. It shall be the duty of the several township clerks to furnish to Township

the county overseers, at the usual time of making out the same, lists of Clerks to furall persons liable to perform statute labor on county roads, under the nish lists of 20 provisions of any by-law passed by the county council for that purpose. Persons liable

3. The several county municipal corporations may, by any such by-Fines for nelaws, inflict reasonable fines or penalties for the neglect or refusal to glect, &c. discharge the duties imposed by such by-laws.
