HEREAS in the present State of the Province of Lower Canada the House of Assembly of the said Province, constituted under the Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act to repeal 31 G. 3. c. 31. certain Parts of an Act passed in the Fourteenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled 'An Act for making more effectual Provision for the · Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to · make further Provision for the Government of the said Province. cannot be called together without serious Detriment to the Interests of the said Province, by reason-whereof the Government of the said Province cannot be duly administered according to the Provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to make temporary Provision for the Government of Lower Canada, in order that Parliament may be enabled, after mature Deliberation, to make permanent 2 Arrangements for the Constitution and Government of the said Province, upon such a Basis as may best secure the Rights and Liberties and promote the Interests of all Classes of Her Majesty's Subjects in the said Province: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's (43.) most
