spent ten days on the tract, making surveys and topographical maps and outlining a plan of action for the reforestation project.

The tract consists of 1,700 acres and has practically all been lumbered over for pulp wood by the National Paper Products Company and its predecessor, the Carthage Tissue Paper Company. It is now proposed to plant about seventy-five acres this year and each year a certain amount until the tract is completely reforested. Several pulp and papepr companies in this region are now reforesting their Adirondack tracts and it is likely that many others will follow suit in future years.

## REFORESTATION A PUBLIC

 JOB.Federal and provincial governments should contribute appropriations for reforestation purposes in Canada, said Mr. A. E. Clark, of Toronto, in an address to the Electric Club, for " the very high cost of re-
producing forests is the reason lumbermen and timber intere should not be blamed for lack of tivity along reforestation lines. lumber concern is justified in maki reforestation investments which not fruitify for at least one hundr years, although pulp wood and sim ${ }^{1}$ grades can be reproduced in fro thirty to forty years. Governmmen have so far seen fit to shirk this o ligation."

There should be no comparisoll, said, between reforestation methods European countries and Canada. soils were different and the metho adopted in Europe are entirely in ${ }^{2}$ plicable here.
