involve him on expenses.
His occupation took him to
the plains, and a small sum
would pay for the time spent
in making the necessary
explanations. I have no
recollection of the circumstances
and did not know that Mr.
McKay had given him a letter,
but Mr. McKay himself will
be the best judge of what would
be right under the circumstances.
