### EXCEPTION TO THE ABOVE.

Any person who has purchased a wooded lot, and paid the first instalment thereon, on furnishing the Agent of the Department with an affidavit that he has settled, or purposes settling, on said lot, shall, on payment of the usual fee of \$4.00, be entitled to receive a license to cut and remove Railway Ties, Telegraph Poles, Tamarac Knees, Shingle Bolts, Cordwood and Hemlock, from the first fifteen acres cleared for cropping, without paying dues therefor.
