Leckie, and party, made a formal visit to the Station. A guard of honour was arranged. The W.D. Precision Squad from Reekcliffe gave a demonstration in the Drill Hall in the evening, which was followed by an "April Fools'" Dance in the Recreation Hall. Squadron Officer Walker and Taylor, Flight Officer Moorehouse, S.O.Yule and Fahrenheltz attended. Group Captain A. Raymond (C621) reported today preparatory to taking over command. | |

| | 3rd Apr.1943 | | Normal flying day. Two slight accidents on main aerodrome. R170621 LAC Harrison, J.L., swung Harvard 2574 on landing. Aircraft ran off runway into snow. No injury. J14828 Pilot Officer J.W. Wright with R154113 LAC Bassett, C. (student) landed in bad cross wind in Harvard 2583. Aircraft swung and rudder came in contact with frozen slush. No injury. Both D categories. Dance in the Officers' Mess in the evening was well attended. | |
