 "since delivery at Victoria. Should  
 "this not be the case and the flour  
 "has been sent from the mill like  
 "this sample, we would reduce  
 "its value fifteen cents (15¢) per  
 "hundred; and if any worse than  
 "sample, would condemn it altogether.

In reply to your letter I  
 by no means wish to be stopped  
 if you will ascertain and inform  
 me whether the flour delivered  
 was as dirty as that contained  
 in the sample transmitted, or  
 whether the better flour became  
 dirty in some way since the delivery  
 at Victoria was made by the West
