- 1 JAMES GILRAY, caricaturist, died 1815.  
Sir DAVID WILKIE, painter and angler, died 1841.  
*Pilgrimage commences to St. Patrick's purgatory, Lough Derry (Co. Donegal) once for unspotted ("Holy") trout.*
- 2 CHRISTOPHER MARLOWE ("Kit"), poet, died 1593. [See "*Musa Piscatrix*."
- 3 General Sir JAMES ALEXANDER, author, and editor of "*Angling in Canada*," born 1800.
- 4 ROBERT TANNAHILL, Scottish riverside poet, born 1774.  
Sir WILLIAM ROSS, artist and angler, born 1794.
- 5 "HI-REGAN," angling writer, born 1837.  
W. YARRELL, naturalist, and angler, born 1784.
- 6 JOHN RENNIE, of Preston-Kirk, Haddingtonshire, N.B., engineer, designed first or first salmon ladder, born 1761.  
R. D. BLACKMORE, writer of "*Lorna Doone*," etc., angler, born 1825.  
HENRY SINCLAIR HALL, chief promoter of the "eyed-hook" system of angling, born 1800.
- 7 Sir SAMUEL BAKER, explorer, writer, angler, born 1821.  
Dr. RICHARD CARMICHAEL, famous angler and fly dresser; he was swallowed in sand near Dublin, 1849.  
Sir JOHN MILLAIS, P.R.A., artist and angler, born, Southampton, 1829.
- 8 GEORGE WITHER, poet, born 1588.  
BEN JONSON ("Rare Ben"), dramatist, born 1674.  
HENRY S. HALL, M.A., writer of mathematical handbooks, angler, and promoter of "eyed hooks," for use in angling, 1848.
- 9 The Rev. CHARLES KINGSLEY, novelist, poet, angler, born 1819. [See "*Musa Piscatrix*."  
WILLIAM COLLINS, died 1759.  
Rev. JOHN HODGSON, died 1845.
- 10 Feast of St. Anthony of Padua, patron of fishes.  
RICHARD LOVELL EDGEWORTH, writer, an enthusiastic but most unskilful angler, 1817.
- 11 THOMAS PENNANT, naturalist and fisher, born 1723.
- 12 THOMAS RANDOLPH, poet, born 1605.  
THOMAS CAMPBELL, poet, angler, died 1844.
- 13 The Rev. R. H. BARRAM, (author of "*Ingoldsby Legends*"), an apt angler with Kentish rivers, died 1845.
- 14 WILLIAM COBBETT, economist, journalist, writer ("*Rural Rides*," ) and angler, died 1835.
- 15 GEORGE SELWYN MARRYAT, accomplished dry fly angler, born 1840.
- 16 WILLIAM SMELLIE, naturalist, died 1795.  
THOMAS SANDBY, water-colour painter and angler, died 1798.
- 17 The Rev. GILBERT WHITE (of Selborne), writer, naturalist, and pisciculturist, 1793.
- 18 WILLIAM THOMPSON (of Belfast), naturalist, early observer of, and writer on Irish species, born 1805.
