There is only One 'whom not having seen we The love of love.' * And there is no love com-Jesus: parable to the love which He has inspired in the breasts of the children of men. Think of St. Francis of Assisi. It was a vision St. Francis of Jesus that transformed him; and of Assisi. it is told how 'from that hour his heart was wounded and melted at the remembrance of Think of St. the Lord's Passion.' + St. Thomas Thomas Aquinas. 'Thou hast written Aquinas, well of Me, Thomas,' said the voice from the Crucifix as he bowed in prayer: 'what recompense dost thou desire?' 'None St. Bernard of Clairvaux. other,' answered the saint, 'than Thyself, O Lord.' Think of St. Bernard of Clairvaux:

'Jesus, the very thought of Thee
With sweetness fills my breast;
But sweeter far Thy face to see,
And in Thy presence rest.
