LIBERATION OF SERBIA FORECAST BY LLOYD GEORGE

Little Nation About To Be Made Fresh and More Wonderful
LUNCHEON IN LONDON
Tendered Premier Pasitch, "Grand Old Man Of Serbia"

LONDON, Aug. 8. - via Reuter's Ottawa agency - At a luncheon given to-day in the Savoy Hotel, in honor of the Premier of Serbia, M. Pasitch, Lloyd George said that "we owe more to M. Pasitch and Premier Venizelos of Greece than I can possibly reveal at present."

"Serbia," he said, "which had been covered by a dirt of Turkish barbarism, was about to be cleansed and would appear fresh and wonderful. The first condition of peace was complete restoration without reservation."

"However long the war may last," added Mr. Lloyd George, "British honor is involved in seeing Serbia freed."

The Only Honorable Peace. Premier Pasitch, whom Lord Cecil described as the "grand old man of Serbia," after expressing his deepest thanks for what Britain had done for the small nations, said that Germany now spoke of an honorable peace. Such a peace could only be secured if the peoples under Austro-German rule were set free.

"If," he said, "France gets back Alsace-Lorraine; if the Italians accomplish unity with their still unredeemed brethren; if the unity of the Serbs, Croats, and Slovenes is achieved; if the Czechs and Slovaks are united and independent, and if the Polish and Rumanian questions are solved, then only will an honorable peace be secured."
