MODEL SCHOOL WIPED OUT

The secretary of the Athens Model School was surprised a few days ago to receive a brief note from the Deputy Minister of Education to the effect that in consequence of the adoption of a certain reorganization (the nature of which was not stated), the Athens Model School would not be continued.

This was altogether unexpected, as the restoration of the Model Schools was equivalent to an admission that a mistake had been made in abolishing them or, at least, that the government's action had been premature.

Shortly after the Model Schools were abolished it was found necessary to place many country schools in charge of young boys or girls who had received absolutely no training as teachers and, in some cases, had not even a Junior Leaving certificate.

Then came such an indignant protest from the people that the government yielded and restored a number of the Model Schools. Judging from the Athens Model, which last fall qualified 27 teachers, the model schools were doing good work and rapidly relieving the shortage. And now, without warning, the government resumes its policy of depriving the country children of an opportunity of entering the teaching profession by attempting to force an attendance at the Normal Schools.

Not many people can afford to send a child to the public and high school for twelve years and then pay out at least \$400 for a Normal training.

The vacillating policy of the government in respect to the important matter of education has been such as to earn the unanimous condemnation of the country people of the province. Many students are now passing through the high schools because they relied upon the permanence of the re-established model schools, and to their parents the loss will be serious. It is unnecessary to ask what the Liberals of the province think of this policy, but will the Conservatives vote in favor of it?
