London, March 3 —In the House of Commons yesterday, D. Lloyd George (Liberal) moved a reduction of the ground that Sir Alfred Milner had been guilty of garbling communica-Orange Free State, to the Colonial

office, Mr. Chamberlain absolutely denied the charge. Referring to President Steyn's alleged desire for peace, the Colonial Secretary said:— "What reliance could be placed upon President Steyn's assurance may be judged from the fact that a few days before the declaration of war he solemnly assured the British Government that under no conditions would the Free State take aggressive action. Yet a short time after that the forces of the Free State were marching side by side with the forces of the Transvaal, and invading British territory."

Lloyd George's motion was defeated.

FROM BLOEMFONTEIN ..

Cape Town, March 3.—The Bloem-fontein Daily Express, in its issue o February 28, printed an article on the relief of Kimberley in which it admits that the Boers were completely outthat the Federal forces always expec another attack on their position at Magersfontein. The mobility of the British astonished the Boers, particularly the Lancers, who raced through every opposition to their daring advance. It is believed that traitors guided the British to Jacobedal. When Commandant Cronje broke bia laager at Magersfontein many women and children had to walk owing to the scarcity of wagons. The paper describes the bombardment of Koodensrand as awful, and the burghers' sufferings were horrible. It adds that the death of Commandant Ferreira, of the Free State army, in Natal. on February 18, depressed his men. He was killed by the accidental bursting of his own rifle. He was very popular, and is much lamented in the Free State. They Will Soon Pay for Themselves on a Farm.

Add at Least a Pound of Butter a Week to each Cow's Production.

There is perhaps more inquiry about cream separators than any other line of dairy machinery at the present time. While a limited number of separators have been disposed of to farmers, yet the demand is nothing, in my opinion, to what it will be in a few short years. I think it would pay the patrons of the Maple City Creamery to have a separator of their own and separate the milk at home, and send the cream only to the factory, thereby saving the excense of hauling the milk to the factory; the cream could be preserved and delivered twice a week instead of every day as at present. Besides, the advantage of having the warm, sweet, new milk to feed is by no means a small point in question. It may be very difficult to get all the patrons of a factory to buy separators but the advisability of doing so cannot be questioned; 'especially where the patrons are four or five miles or more from the factory. One of the ques-tions against the small separator is the price. When a farmer is asked to pay seventy or eighty dollars for a separator for eight or ten cows he will think twice before he will sign an order for one, although I doubt if there is any other implement on the farm that will pay for itself as soon as the separator. Just a word of advice about the kind to buy? There is no doubt but any of the different kinds offered on the market to-day will separate the cream from the milk. The machine the farmer wants is the one most simply constructed and easiest to operate; the fewer pieces there are the easier it will be to keep clean, and less liable to wear. Everything else being equal, always choose the machine that has a solid bowl and you will soon be able to say it is worth more than a cow and costs less than

A COMPARISON.

Below I will give you some data recently published by L. C. Rogers, who lately resigned the position of instructor in butter making in the O.

From 150 trials made at the O. A C., in comparing the separator plan with the gravitation method during five years, in which a total of of 7,600 lbs., of milk was tested for each plan, the following table of results is compiled

METHOD OF SKIMMING Shallow pans, 38 per cent. was the average of butter fat lost in skim.

Deep setting, .31 per cent, was the average of butter fat lost in skim milk. Separator, 10 per cent was the average of butter fat lost in skim.

milk. Investigations were also made t determine the loss of butter fat in skim milk at thirty six farm dairies. Ninety-six samples were tested, which showed an average loss of 9 per cent of fat in the skim milk, which was equal to one quarter of the total in the milk before skimming. If aver-age normal milk contains 3.6 per cent of fat and 100 lbs of such milk make four pounds of butter, and if, the butter is worth 15c. per pound, the butter fat worth 16.66 cents per pound. At this valuation, according to the above table, the value of the loss of butter fat from the separator plan would be 1.66 cents, deep setting, 5.14
