Sgt. Chet Angus arrived at Quebec on Tuesday on the transport 'Cassidy', and reached Wolfville yesterday morning. Sgt. Angus went overseas with the 17th Batt. in October, 1918. He was transferred to the 5th Batt. and went to France with that unit in February, 1917.
