Cut One-quarter

Among the matters engaging the attention of the Hon. Rudolphe Lemieux during his recent visit to Europe, were arrangements for the exchange of parcels between the United Kingdom and Canada. For many years past the charges have been 16 cents for the first pound or a fraction of a pound, and 12 cents for each subsequent reduced to a uniform rate of 12 cents per pound, with a maximum limit of weight of 11 pounds for a parcel.

The parcel post rates between Canada, Jamaica, Trinidad, St Lucia, Barbadoes, Leeward Islands, and British Guiana have also been reduced to a uniform rate of 12 cents per lb. or fraction of a pound, the limit of weight for one parcel being 11 lbs. The Leeward Islands include the post offices of Dominico, Montzerrat, and St. Kits, the latter office being an exchange office for parcels for and from Nevis and Virgin Islands.
