The steamer Europa, left Liverpool on the 15th instant, at 6 P. M., via Halifax, where she arrived on the 25th, at 5 P. M., and left at 8. She arrived at Boston at 6 P. M., though she was detained off Halifax 9 hours by fog.

GOVERNMENT DEBENTURES.

The late Government was authorized to issue Debentures to meet the appropriations for Public Works. The amount of the appropriations to be provided for by this means was £1,218,184, 3s., the other portion having been provided for out of the balance of the million and a half loan, and from other sources. Instead of raising the required amount the financial plans of the late government entirely failed. To make matters worse, they entered into engagements to the extent of £100,000, beyond the appropriations made by Parliament. The finances were in this condition when they
